

Melbourne Water has identified the following major reasons for the loss of the platypus in the Merri Catchment:

- pollutants including sediment
- pest plants and animals
- riparian and grassland habitat loss
- rapid urbanisation (including the use of pesticides)
- climate change
- Creek modifications and diversions
- intensity of stormwater
- litter
