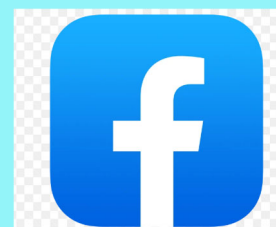

## ROTARY PROJECTS AROUND THE GLOBE

### France



More than a dozen Rotarians and friends in southeastern France donned inflatable dinosaur costumes and stumbled along a 100-meter course in a playful footrace that raised funds and awareness for Rotary's mission to end polio. Organized by District 1730, the T-Rex Race took place last October during the Fréjus International Air Festival, a kite fair that draws thousands of people. "The idea came to me to create an event to rejuvenate the image of Rotary in the fight against polio," says Dinh Hoan Tran, the district's immediate past governor and member of the Rotary Club of Nice. Spectators could place bets on the contestants. "We made people laugh and we informed people," says Tran. More than 40 of the district's 71 clubs participated in the event, as the district motivated clubs to "support PolioPlus to the tune of about \$45,000,"
