Fellow Pascoe Vale Rotarians,

We are writing to inform you of an executive decision made regarding an adjustment to the required procedure for new member applications.

As a result of a strong recommendation from our District Governor David McPherson, our club is refining procedures required for new member admission.

Effective immediately: Every new member application **must** have a Department of Justice **Working With Children** accreditation before they can be accepted for membership of the Pascoe Vale Rotary Club. This accreditation will accompany the Membership Application Form. Membership to Pascoe Vale Rotary will not be ratified until the WWC accreditation has been issued.

This decision is being taken to demonstrate Pascoe Vale Rotary's commitment to:

- a) protecting any child under 18 years of age who has been entrusted to our care whilst we are undertaking Rotary duties.
- b) protecting the community, we serve.
- c) protecting the integrity of Rotary's name in the community and wider afield.
- d) protecting our members whilst undertaking Rotary duties with children under 18 years of age.
- e) ensuring there is no potential for unnecessary legal action against members when acting as a Rotary member dealing with children under 18 years of age.
- f) Last but certainly not least, it is not enough for our club to be doing the right thing, we must be SEEN to be doing the right thing in this regard.

We commend this procedural adjustment to you and I am sure you will all realize the wisdom of such a decision is doubtless in the best interests of our children, our community, our members, and Pascoe Vale Rotary.

planting pawpaw and banana trees on the fruit farm. He didn't stop there; he was also in the forefront in helping to clean the compound and collecting the litter to the dumping site.










