Supporting families with sick and premature babies. (RABS)

This is a Family Project for Neta Kirby (District Governor 9790) whose daughters Ruth and Monica both went through traumatic births with sick and premature babies. They understand the emotional and financial pressure on families in this situation and valued the amazing support they received from the Life's Little Treasures Foundation. This project will provide much-needed funding to "Life's Little Treasures Foundation" so they can continue to support thousands of families like Neta's.

In Australia, 1 in 10 babies are born premature, ie before 37 weeks of gestation. Over 48,000 babies are admitted to Neonatal Intensive Care Units or Special Care Nurseries every year. As you can imagine, this is an extremely stressful time for the families of prem babies. Funds raised through this project will support the "Victorian Families Support Program" for the "Lifes Little Treasures Foundation". The program will provide information, financial assistance, peer support,

Supporting Kidney Disease Patients in Outback Australia

Pukatja is an extremely remote indigenous community in South Australia. It experiences kidney disease at a rate fifteen times higher than the national average.

With the nearest treatment facility about 1,000km away, dialysis entails relocation, far away from the patient's support network of family and community – a devastating blow, especially for someone already suffering the trauma of serious illness.

Delivering treatment closer to home results in dramatically better health outcomes, reduced economic and community impacts and reduced need for ancillary services, such as social workers and interpreters.



The Rotary Club of Waikerie, along with numerous Clubs and Districts, from Australia and the USA, funded the A\$200,000 purchase of the medical equipment to set up a dialysis facility in the far northwest of the state. They partnered with the WDNWPT Aboriginal Community. The Rotary Foundation provided A\$70,000 in Global Grant funding.

Update on Timor Rotary Consortium - WASH Project

Our Club was a donor back in (October 2020) and they seek our Club's renewal of support for the Project's next stage, for which they are applying for a Global Grant.

Since then, in and around the region of Baguia in eastern Timor Leste, 62 Galvanised 5,500 Litre Water Tanks have been installed and 7 three cubicle School Toilets have been constructed, principally by locals using skills imparted to them by Rotary Volunteer Teams. Because of these learned skills they were able to continue work on the Project during the 3 years of Covid isolation and are also able to repair and maintain the Water Tanks and Toilets themselves.





The Programme creates great international goodwill and supplies much needed clean water and sanitation to remote mountain villages where the great majority of locals live a subsistence life and where open defecation is practiced.

A Global Grant application with a budget of AUD \$100,000 has been prepared and as mentioned earlier we would welcome your Club's renewed participation both financially and by club members participating in visiting Rotary Teams.

In 2020-2021 several Rotary Clubs made donations of \$10,000 and we hope this level of generosity will be repeated again in 2023-2024. Over a dozen Rotary Clubs and 2 Inner Wheel Districts have made donations to this Project and we ask you please to pass on this information to your club's International Chair for consideration by their Committee.

Rotary Regionalisation

Last week, members of the Steering Group hosted a series of webinars to share information about the work currently happening in the Regionalisation Pilot.

Over 200 people tuned in across the three webinars.
