



#### **AUSTRALIAN REMEMBRANCE STORY**

### The Story of Simpson and His Donkey

One of the most enduring tales of heroism from World War I involves John Simpson Kirkpatrick, famously known as "Simpson." Born in the UK and later migrating to Australia, Simpson enlisted in the Australian Army and served as a stretcher-bearer during the Gallipoli Campaign in 1915.

Upon landing at Gallipoli, Simpson discovered a donkey abandoned by the Turkish soldiers. He immediately saw an opportunity to use the donkey to help evacuate the wounded from the battlefield. With incredible bravery and disregard for his own safety, Simpson tirelessly transported wounded soldiers from the front lines to the beach for evacuation, all under constant enemy fire.

Simpson's efforts became legendary among the troops. He and his donkey, named Duffy, navigated the treacherous terrain of Gallipoli, saving many lives. Tragically, Simpson was killed by machine-gun fire after only three and a half weeks on the battlefield, but his legacy lived on.

Simpson and his donkey symbolize the courage, compassion, and dedication of the Australian forces. Every Remembrance Day, Australians honor heroes like Simpson, reflecting on their sacrifices and the enduring spirit of mateship and service.


