AG Pat, PP Peter Wilson & myself attended the Broadmeadows Rotary Club's 17th annual Paul Harris Birthday Celebration Dinner last Wednesday 8th May.

Guest speaker was a local Glenroy Boy, Teacher, and Crime Fiction Writer, John Carroll.

John Carroll's family moved from Newport to Harold Street, Glenroy in the mid-fifties at the height of the post-war boom. At that time roads were unmade, there was no sewerage, and there were lots of open spaces stretching for miles around. John said, "A great playground for kids!"

John attended Glenroy State School and Glenroy High School, then completed an Arts Degree at Melbourne University. Like many of his generation, he was the first member of his family to gain a tertiary education. He then embarked on a teaching career, mainly as an English teacher, at numerous High Schools, including Glenroy High. He became a Senior Teacher in 1974, at Moreland High School.

During the mid-1980s, he quit teaching to become a full-time writer of crime fiction. Some of his titles include Catspaw, Tropic of Fear, Hard Yards, No Way Back, The Clan (short-listed for a Ned Kelly award for best crime novel), Blindside, and 8 Hours to Die, among others.

He has co-authored a senior English textbook on film studies, Exploring Film as a Text, as well as contributing short stories, travel articles, and book reviews, during which time he was a regular crime reviewer for the Australian Book Review

A good night was had by all the clubs present.
