Police and PTSD

- 1 in 3 police employees experience high or very high psychological distress
- 1 in 5 will go onto develop PTSD
- Most people in the general population are exposed to 3-5 traumatic events in a life time. Police are exposed to 400-600 traumatic events during their careers
- It is estimated that 20% of the 15,000 Victoria Police veterans have PTSD

More support is required to help Police Veterans and your Board is looking at options to assist.






What do RABBITS and POLIO have in common?

We know what happened when we didn't finish the job with the rabbits.






Selection for 2025-26 Rotary International President
