

ALARE - REPORT

APRIL 2024

Alare likes mobile phones so that he can play games. When you see him following someone and not being with animals as he prefers, you just know that there is a phone which there are games in it and he is allowed to play if a contractor is around or a staff member allows his or her phone to be used by the children. He used to follow me anywhere I go. Sometimes he pretends as if he is playing around me, but the real fact is that he is there because of the phone and within no time he will ask for it. He is very sharp when he is taught a game. He used to score more than me in several games and normally feels very happy. He likes always to be the one who scores the highest so that he can boast. Nowadays he is grown up. He doesn't cry when he is being scored low. Previously when you play any game against him and you score high, he either gets angry or even cries. Like in the picture, the other boys were not present while girls were playing games, but he was present.





Alare was used to grazing cattle before with the farm boys. When they were told that they will be grazing cattle's every morning, he was fine as he has been doing it before. He was happy and had his stick for grazing ready. He could also identify the cow which was pregnant. He can make a good veterinary doctor in future as he has lot of interest in animals. Let alone the cattle, the new puppies which were brought were like his own. He handled them very well and didn't want to see anyone











mistreating them. If the other child carries one and Alare sees they have carried it in a wrong way, he will complain and instruct that person to carry it well. The puppies are really loved.







When schools were about to open, I opted to shave the boys. Alare is much affected by the ringworms to the extent I can say they are drugs resistance. I don't know what might be the cause. There was a time when we thought it was maybe they have been stayed for long without being dewormed. He was then dewormed but still he was not healed. I am politely requesting, in the next volunteer group visit if we can have some drugs of the same from Australia. Every time he takes a bath, Aunt Lozi makes sure that he applies a good amount of oil in his scalp probably it could help but also it didn't work.

















Alare can become a good farmer. During the planting season, he helped the farm boys plant maize together with the other children. He is also not lazy in the farm. When they were told to prepare their own farm, as Mamma Cathy suggested each child should have a small area where he or she can care for their own vegetables as a good learning experience.

Alare started immediately and completed digging the same day. It was as unfortunate as the first place which he cultivated was changed as it was not suitable for planting. He was shown another place where he dug immediately. He planted some greens and monitoring them very well without being told each day. As it is during the rainy season, then he is not required to do irrigation.
